It's not too early!



Pickering and Rangel Applications Open NOW

Both the <u>Thomas R. Pickering Foreign Affairs Graduate Program</u> and the <u>Charles B. Rangel International Affairs Graduate Fellowship Program</u> are now accepting applications for their 2025-2027 cohorts. These fellowships provide financial assistance for a two-year graduate program in an international affairs-related field at a U.S.-accredited institution of higher learning, with a five-year service commitment as a Foreign Service Officer upon successful completion of all requirements.

Rangel applications are due by 11:59 Eastern on September 19. Pickering applications are due by 11:59 Eastern on September 26.

Internship News: Coming Soon!

United States Foreign Service Internship Program (USFSIP): Open to rising sophomores and rising juniors at the time of application, this is a merit- and need-based two-summer paid internship for the Summers of 2025 and 2026. Candidates must commit to both summers; the first will take place at the U.S. Department of State in Washington, DC, and the second at an embassy or consulate overseas (10 weeks each summer). This is paid at the GS-04 level; travel and housing are also paid. Applicants must demonstrate financial need (FAFSA or statement of financial need) and have a minimum 3.2 GPA. Applications should open in late August/early September 2024. Interested candidates can learn more about the program <a href="https://example.com/here-need/based-two-summers-need/based-tw

Student Internship Program (SIP): The paid Student Internship Program (SIP), is merit-based (3.2 minimum GPA) and runs throughout the year with summer, fall, and spring cohorts who undertake full-time 10-week paid internships. These take place either in Washington, DC at the U.S. Department of State or (limited opportunities) at U.S. Embassy or Consulate overseas; we pay travel and housing. Summer 2025 internship applications will open in early October 2024. Students must have completed at least 60 credit hours by the end of the 2024-25 academic year to be eligible. First-year graduate students are also eligible to apply. You can learn more about our internship program here, and you can sign up to receive notification when the application opens. It is important to note that students must be returning to school immediately following the internship to be eligible for the program.

Temporary Hire Students perform a variety of functions and tasks in support of the organization to which they are assigned. Work assignments will involve problem identification, analysis, and resolution. Specific duties may include the preparation and presentation of briefings directly related to work assigned. They must be in attendance at and enrolled in a graduate, baccalaureate, or associate degree program. They are placed on one-year temporary appointments, which can be extended in one-year increments until the student graduates. Their appointment terminates upon graduation or when the student no longer attends school, even if the expiration date on the current appointment has not been reached.

Applications close on September 30, 2024.
